Soviet geologist to lecture

Soviet geologist Georg Gorshkov will present two free public lectures at the University of Oregon on Tuesday and Thursday, March 6 and 8, in 254 Science.

He will discuss "Volcanoes of Kamchatka and the Kurile Islands" at 12:30 p.m., Tuesday, and "The Great Eruptions of Bezymianny and Shiveluch Volcanoes in Kamchatka", at 12:30 p.m., Thursday.

Dr. Gorshkov is a research scientist at the Institute for Solid Earth Physics in Moscow, a Corresponding Member of the Academy of Sciences in the USSR, and formerly director of the Soviet Institute of Volcanology in Kamchatka.

He is spending several months as a visiting professor at the UO Center for Volcanology as a Senior Fellow of the U.S. National Science Foundation.

His descriptive lectures will be illustrated by slides. The talks are sponsored by the Volcanology Center and the Department of Geology.

Guitarist and jug band featured
