Architect to lecture

Marshall Meyers, Philadelphia architect and associate of Louis Kahn, will discuss "Louis Kahn's Kimbell Art Museum: Form and Design," in a slide illustrated lecture at 8 p.m. tonight in 107 Lawrence.

Meyers is the project architect of the Kimbell Art Museum at Ft. Worth, Texas. He has worked on numerous Kahn buildings.

Currently, Meyers, who is an accomplished photographer, is a visiting critic and lecturer at Montana State University, Bozeman, Montana.

His appearance at the University is sponsored by the department of architecture, School of Architecture and Allied Arts.

The event features dancing and drumming competitions by members of Northwest tribes. Athletic Committee members named

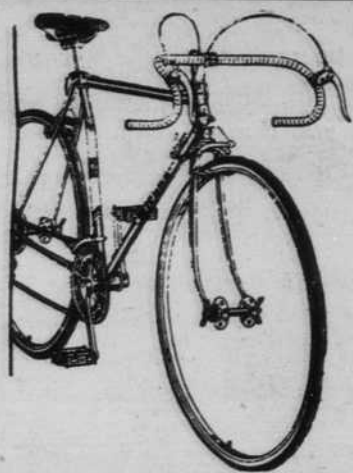
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
