A University student pleaded guilty to a charge of disorderly conduct before the Student Court Tuesday and was sentenced to disciplinary probation for the remainder of spring quarter.

The charge was filed by a resident assistant of the Hamilton dormitory complex after he was physically assaulted while trying to break up a kegger in the dormitory showers on April 2.

Acting dean of Liberal Arts named

Paul Holbo, professor of history and associate dean of the College of Liberal Arts at the University, has been named Acting Dean of the College of Liberal Arts.

Burton Moyer, dean of the College since January, 1971, died Saturday.

Holbo has been on the University faculty since 1959. He has been associate dean of the College since 1970, but has continued part-time teaching in the History Department. He has been particularly active in the promotion of Advanced Placement in Oregon high schools.

With his appointment as acting dean, he has been relieved of most of his teaching duties.

A search committee will be named to start looking for a new dean, according to Harry Alpert, vice president and provost for academic affairs.

Tax plan opponent to speak

State Senator John Burns, D-Portland, will discuss the Governor's tax plan at a public meeting on the University campus today.

His talk, "The Governor's Tax: An Opponent's Viewpoint," will be at 3 p.m. in the EMU.

His appearance is jointly sponsored by the College of Business Administration and the Associated Students' Cultural Forum.

New Alumni Relations director named

Michael Brundage, former University varsity football player and member of the Class of 1966, has been named Director of the Office of Alumni Relations, announced University President Robert Clark.

Brundage will take over his new responsibility as Alumni Director and secretary of the Alumni Association early in May. He succeeds Richard Imwalle, who has resigned to go to Pomona College, California.

The new Alumni Director comes to the University from Portland State University, where he has been an instructor in physical education and head offensive coordinator for football since last fall.

Brundage was born in Portland August 5, 1943, and was raised in Roseburg, where he attended schools. He was graduated from Roseburg High School in 1961 and was named outstanding Oregon athlete that year.

As an undergraduate at Oregon he played in both football and tennis. During his last two years here, he was quarterback for the varsity football squad. As a senior he was captain of the varsity squad and of the tennis team, earning letters in both sports. He was also president of Order of the O.

Following his graduation, he played professional football for two years with the Pittsburgh Steelers and with the Denver Broncos. From 1969-71, he taught and was coach at Roseburg High School and then went to Albany as head coach for South Albany High School. He joined the faculty at Portland State University in the fall of 1972.
