The broadcasts will be programmed from the Metropolitan and transmitted by a 5,000 cycle balanced network line.

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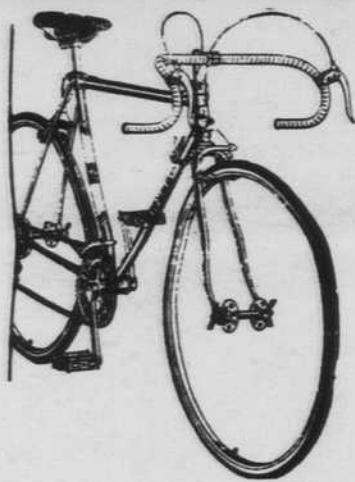
