Russian professor receives fellowship

James Rice, associate professor of Russian at the University, is one of 14 scholars from throughout the U.S. who have received 1973 postdoctoral fellowships from the American Council of Learned Societies.

The fellowships are designed to assist young scholars in enlarging their range of knowledge by study in fields outside their present area of specialization and are awarded in a national competition.

Rice will spend the summer and the 1973-74 academic year on sabbatical leave from the University as an associate of the Russian Research Center at Harvard University.

His research will involve a study of the history of science from 1600 to the present time.

Rice has been at Oregon since 1967. He is a Harvard graduate, who received his master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Chicago.

The American Council of Learned Societies, with headquarters in New York, is a private non-profit federation of 39 national scholarly associations devoted to the advancement of humanistic studies in all fields of learning.

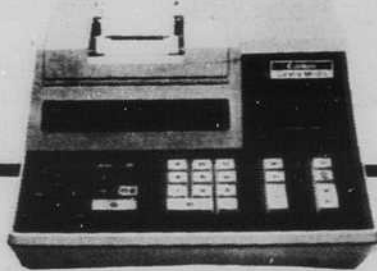

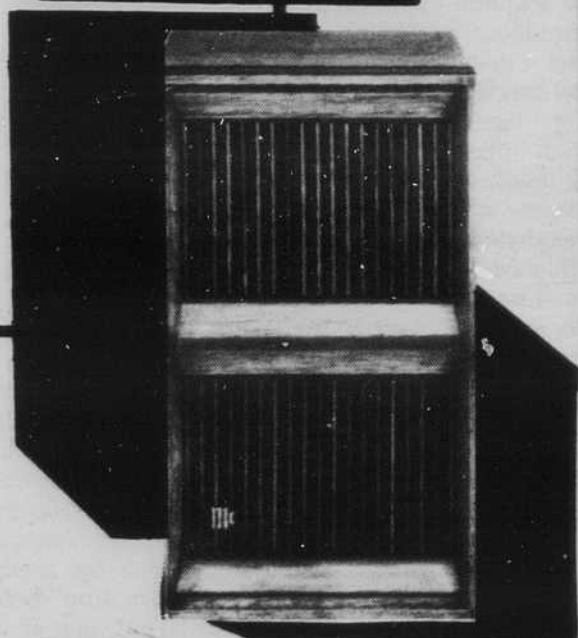
