suffering from drug problems for the past three years. In view of the
fact that the use and abuse of hard drugs such as heroin is on the rise in
this community, the Addiction Center was established February 1,
1973. The center is aimed at heroin, barbiturate and amphetamine
abusers and offers a variety of services. These include live-in
detoxification, on-going counseling, group therapy, vocational
guidance and other rehabilitative services.

was just recently sold and the new owners have a specific use for the
building. White Bird must relocate by June 10. They are in need of a
