The Webfoot Express is coming.

For the first time on the west coast, new or returning students from the California area will have a chance to ride the Webfoot Express when they come to the University for fall term.

Two Amtrack train cars, with a capacity of 44 people each, will be coming from Los Angeles and Oakland for University students. The cars will be filled on a first-come first-serve basis with students and possibly a few teachers who want to get acquainted with other students.

The cost for a place on the Webfoot Express is \$45 from Los Angeles to Eugene and \$35 from Oakland to Eugene. The dates for the trip are Sept. 16 and 17. If these first cars are filled, a second trip will be offered Sept. 19 and 20.

There will also be films and entertainment for the students offered during the trip. Meals are available on the train, but the price is not included in the basic fare.
