### Peace group meeting slated

The Eugene Peace Action Committee (EPAC) will meet tonight at 8 p.m. at the Newman Center, 1850 Emerald St., to discuss plans for future anti-war activities.

EPAC calls itself a loose coalition of anti-war, anti-imperialist organizations. It is working on the defense of Ngo Chi Thien, a Vietnamese sailor resisting deportation to South Vietnam, medical aid to Indochina, dissemination of information and other related activities.

EPAC is also planning a demonstration to protest "the continuing police state and imprisonment of 200,000 political prisoners in South Vietnam," says EPAC representative John Lanier. The demonstration will take place in mid-November in coordination with similar demonstrations being planned in cities across the country.

### Noon organ recitals return

The Tuesday noon organ recitals return this fall at the School of Music. Performing today will be veteran Randolph Bourne, playing works by Francois Couperin and Johann Sebastian Bach. James Horwath, new master's candidate and graduate of the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music, will play works by Dietrich Buxtehude and Bach.
