Auto donated to LCC

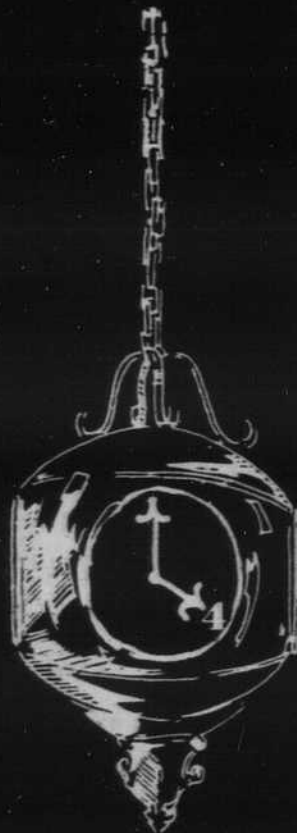
Ford Motor Co. has donated a 1973 Maverick to the auto mechanics department at Lane Community College (LCC).
