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Gleeful reactions were expressed by some individuals questioned, but many turned somber when they considered the national impact of the Vice-President's move.

"It points out to me the depth of corruption in this nation," said a sociology student. "It doesn't stop at Nixon, it goes from Nixon to Agnew and drifts all the way down to the state senators." Maraaret Patoine, chairperson

of the Rubicon Society, a local Republican organization, does not see Agnew as a symbol of creeping corruption in government.

"I'm very thankful that Oregon politicians aren't concerned," said Patoine. "It is incumbent on the people of Oregon to keep our politics clean."

State Representative Wayne Whitehead, the only member of the Oregon Delegation to the Republican Convention to vote against the renomination of Agnew, feels vindicated.

"I took a lot of heat from the Republican Party for that vote," said Whitehead. "At the time I was a television news director and I didn't care for his unfounded attacks on the press. I felt that anyone who made such scurrilous attacks on the news media was a guy with something to hide—at least not a guy I was willing to support."

Some individuals felt that Agnew's sudden decision to step

down came as a result of pressure from above.

"It was either Nixon or Agnew," said Jose Villa, a graduate student. "Agnew had to pay the price."

Others said Agnew resigned because of inevitable indictments involving even more serious charges than income tax evasion.

Agnew's long, vehement protestations of innocence irked many people.

"I was pissed—because if he was guilty he should have said so at the start instead of walking a narrow tightrope between vindication and the slammer," said CSPA major Earl Bjerke. "It surprises me and upsets me, but it won't affect the country. What happens in Washington rarely affects the country."

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"They are a legislative body and can say how the money is going to be distributed, but they can't assign themselves the executive role or disbursement," he added.

Nelson also contended in a memorandum to the Constitution Committee that any funds held by the IFC as reserve beyond the funds allocated to programs, should be transferred to the executive contingency fund, to be administered by the executive along with other funds.

Randy Shilts, chair of IFC, and the only person available for comment, told the Emerald "This was not a victory for the IFC as much as a victory for the students who need effective representation of the IFC."

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
