Breathmobile sets visit to campus

The Christmas Seal Breathmobile will visit the University campus to provide free lung function tests to students and faculty Thursday and Friday.

The Breathmobile, which is owned and operated by the Oregon Lung Association, will be open during the two-day stay from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. The mobile unit will be located in the closed portion of 13th Ave. The breathing tests will be free.

Persons taking the test will blow into a device called a spirometer. An immediate print-out of the results will show several levels of lung function. A Breathmobile staff member will explain each person's test.
