

Framework for sound business necessary, says Rep. Al Ullman

A framework for sound business policy is necessary if the government is to cope effectively with new circumstances developing in our world, said Al Ullman, U.S. Democratic Representative from the 2nd district and acting chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee.

Ullman spoke Saturday morning in the EMU on "The Relationship of Business and Government." His talk, followed by a question and answer period, was sponsored by the Masters of Business Administration Association (MBAA) of the University College of Business Administration.

"The Ways and Means Committee deals daily with problems affecting American business," Ullman said, outlining the need to determine what lies in the public interest and where this falls in respect to business. "In our kind of society, we must live with the basic assumption that the capitalistic system is the most responsive to the needs of the people and of the nation."

The committee held hearings on tax reforms this year, and Ullman commented that "it would be impossible to go back to the days of the simple gross tax. Tax incentives for business help maintain operating stability in the business community," he explained, "but these must be carefully analyzed so tighter lines can be drawn to curb abuses."

Turning to other problems encountered by his committee, Ullman said, "one of the first problems was establishing a viable trading mechanism for international trade." He said two steps in this direction were breaking down tariff barriers and establishing guidelines for protection of injured industries.

"A special project being undertaken is the establishment of a Congressional budgeting procedure, a vehicle whereby we can get a hold on the erosion and inflation taking place in our economic system," Ullman said.

"The Constitution placed in Congress fiscal responsibilities, and once the budgeting procedure is established this can put the Executive office into proper perspective. When asked a question concerning the grounds for impeachment of the President, Ullman said, "We've come to a time when Congress must directly involve itself in dealing with Executive misdeeds." He continued, "The first step is to examine the basis for impeachment in a hard, responsible light, and then decide the procedure to be followed. Simultaneously, under judicially-appointed investigators, the dismissal of Cox must be examined. "At the same time, the office of Vice-President shouldn't be held in hostage," Ullman explained. "If Ford is found qualified, Congress should move ahead to appoint him, and shouldn't try to impose a

Democratic president through impeachment.

Ullman "was shocked" by the President's October 26 press conference. "It shows that the pressure is telling on Nixon, and he's losing judgement." It will be very difficult for Nixon to continue another three years as President, according to Ullman, and perhaps resignation might be the "easier way out."
