Recreational vehicle use to be discussed

Proposed rules governing the use of recreational vehicles on state forest lands will be discussed during a Department of Forestry public hearing on Nov. 20. The hearing will convene in Rm. 20 of the State Capitol Building in Salem at 10 a.m.

The proposed rules call for the designation of open areas for recreational vehicle use and regulation of competitive events. These rules would pertain to some 780,000 acres of state forest land, principally in Western Oregon, and would set guidelines for the use of recreational vehicles on these areas.

Copies of the proposed rules are available at the State Forester's office, 2600 State St., Salem. Persons interested in presenting testimony on the proposed recreational vehicle rules may present oral or written statements at the hearing or send such written testimony to the State Forester.
