selection of any acting president," the letter states.

Contacted at the Hilton Hotel in Portland, Lieuallen flatly denied that he made any such assertions to the council.

"I did not say that and I don't

think a letter written by someone who doesn't have the courage to sign it should be taken very seriously. I didn't say anything that the letter alleges that I said," he stressed.

The meeting between himself and the Advisory Council took place about a month ago, Lieuallen said. He said the

purpose of the meeting was to decide which groups could best decide the composition of the presidential search committee.

Chairman of the Advisory Council Glen Love called the letter "an absolute falsehood" and said "I don't know how anyone could've come up with that." He said Lieuallen made no recommendations of any kinds as to whether faculty members on the search committee should or should not be involved in collective bargaining.

"I think somebody got a hold of this thing third hand and has made a monster out of it," says Love.

"This afternoon at 2:30 p.m. in the EMU Dad's Room, we'll be having a gay life-styles panel," said Randy Shilts, gay activist and Incidental Fee Committee Chair. "Carl Whitman, an early gay activist and author of the landmark paper *Refugees From America: A Gay Manifesto*, will discuss gay communal living from his experience in living in a gay commune in Southern Oregon. Jim Hood, who organized and spear-headed the gay rights bill drive in Eugene, will discuss the basic gay political issues. For people who do not know the basics of gay liberation the panel will be invaluable."

Shilts will moderate the panel.

Friday evening at 7:30 p.m. GPA will sponsor a Walt Whitman poetry reading. Other gay poetry will be read at the event in the Dad's Room, Shilts said.

"On Saturday night we invite the whole campus community to our Gala Dance at 8:30 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom. We'll have live entertainment and a splendid time is guaranteed for all," Shilts said.
