Professor plans land use speech

University law professor Frank Barry will be one of the major speakers at a conference on mining in Anchorage, Alaska, December 10-14, sponsored by the Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission for Alaska.

As solicitor general for the U.S. Interior Department during the Kennedy and Johnson administrations, Barry was involved in a number of important mining cases.

He explains that the Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission was established by the Alaska Native Claims Act of 1971 to recommend to Congress the disposition of some 80 million acres of federal lands in Alaska.

Mining is one of the proposed uses of those public lands, he says.

Representatives of business, industry and conservation organizations will take part in the December 10-14 session.

Food stamps will be sold in Springfield beginning Monday, announced Glenn Sabin, director of Lane County's Food Stamp program.

Sabin said the stamps would be sold in a new office located in the Big M Shopping Center, 303 So. 5th. The office is located in the same building as the State Welfare Department. The Welfare Department determines whether individuals are eligible for food stamps; and the County is responsible for sale of stamps.

He said the office would be open on the second and third week of December (Dec. 3 through 7 and Dec. 17 through 21). Hours will be from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

He said heavy or light demands on the office might cause the hours to change. "But if more people than we anticipate come in, we'll stay open longer," he said.
