Statewide student lobby to hire full-time lobbying co-ordinator

The Associated Oregon Student Lobby, a newly formed state-wide student lobbying organization is currently considering hiring a non-lobbying co-ordinator. The person would be expected to work a 40-hour week and be responsible to a board of directors consisting of the AOSL members' student body presidents.

The director will co-ordinate the activities of both paid and volunteer student lobbyists, conduct preliminary research, arrange meetings, prepare and monitor the budget, act as the representative of the lobby to member schools budgeting bodies, monitor legislative and State Board of Higher Education issues and evaluate the performance of student lobbyists.

Legislation workshop deals with elderly concerns

State Representatives Nancie Fadeley and Ralph Groener, and State Senator George Wingard will speak at a legislative workshop Saturday dealing with legislation concerned with the well-being of the elderly.

The workshop, sponsored by U of O Gerontology Association, will take place on campus, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., in the Gerlinger Hall Alumni Lounge. In addition to the legislators, experts from the community will speak.

The focus of the workshop will be on four bills now pending in the state legislature. They include a social security reform bill, a bill for tighter control of the fitting and sale of hearing aids, a proposal for alternative care for the elderly, and a proposal for new types of sanctions on nursing homes which violate state regulations.

Program chairman David Claussenius said that the workshop offers a good chance for students to meet the three legislators, voice their opinions on the issues being discussed and to hear where the legislators stand. The workshop is open to the general public.

UO artist LaVerne Krause will deliver a free public lecture about her year in Norway (1973-74) this afternoon at 4 in 177 Lawrence. "The Oslo Experience: Influence of the Environment and Ideas in Painting and Printmaking" is the title of the talk, which is part of a series of faculty lectures sponsored by the School of Architecture and Allied Arts.

Dr. Leslie Gottlieb of the Genetics dept. at the University of California at Davis, will speak on "Genetic and eco-physiological studies of an annual plant population and its sympatric derivative species," today at 4:30 p.m. in 361 Science. There will be a tea at 4 preceding the meeting.

Members of the University community concerned for the South Vietnamese political prisoners can participate in a project which urges their release. The CALC (Clergy and Laity Concerned) Peace Office at 1414 Kincaid has tags to which old keys should be attached. The tags ask, "Could this key unlock a prison door?" The sender signs a

statement which reads, "I am deeply concerned about the tens of thousands of men, women, and children who are imprisoned in South Vietnam because they spoke out for peace. The Paris Peace Accords, which the United States signed two years ago, guaranteed their release. Today my tax money is still paying to keep these peacemakers in jail. Their freedom is our responsibility. The key to justice may be in your hands."

The tagged keys, 300 of which are being mailed from Eugene this week by members of WILPF and CALC, are to go to President Ford, to the South Vietnamese ambassador, and to Congressman Andrew Young, who has agreed to help with the project. The project was initiated nationally by the Fellowship of Reconciliation.
