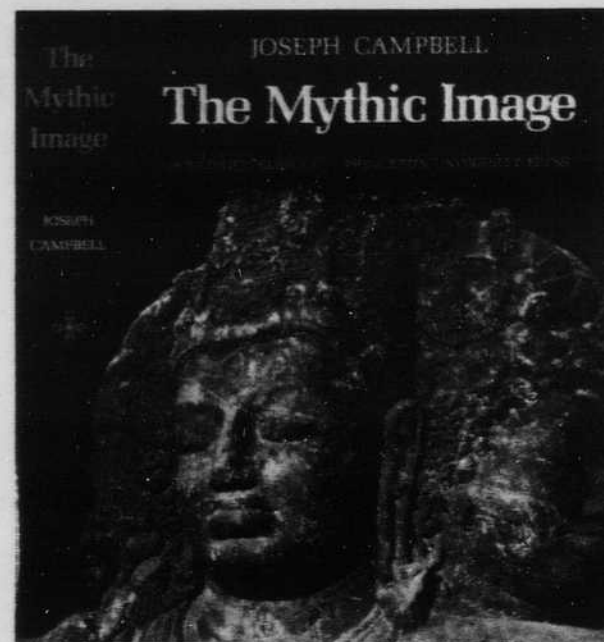

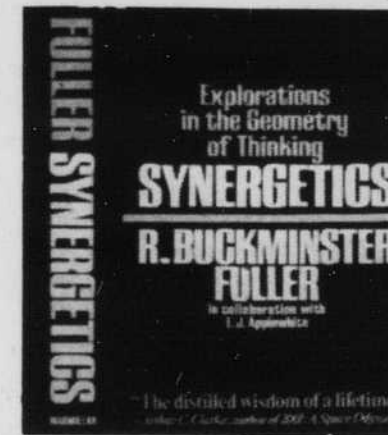
THE MYTHIC IMAGE

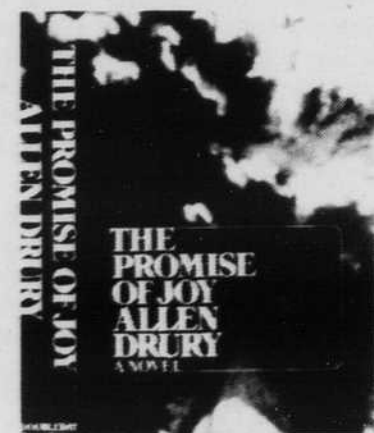


THE ZEN OF RUNNING
