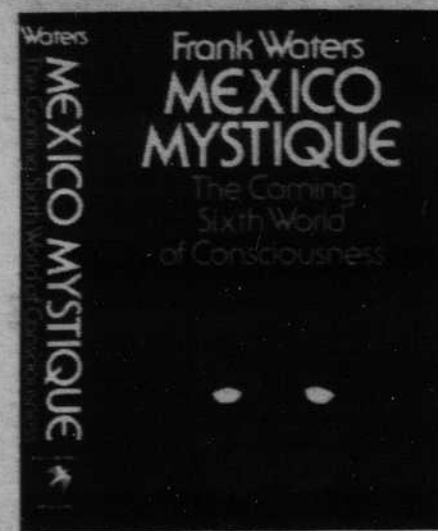

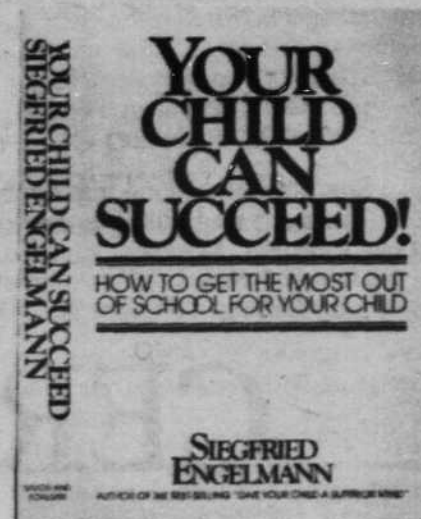

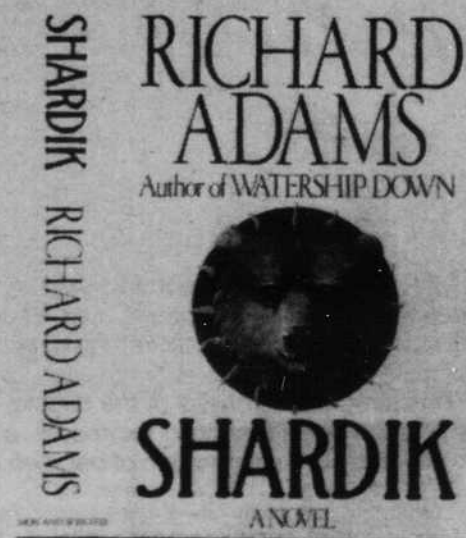


WHAT'S A FATHER FOR?

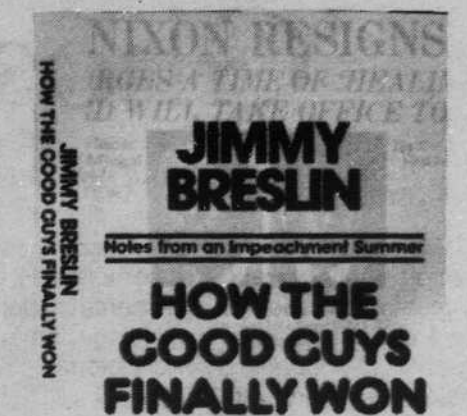

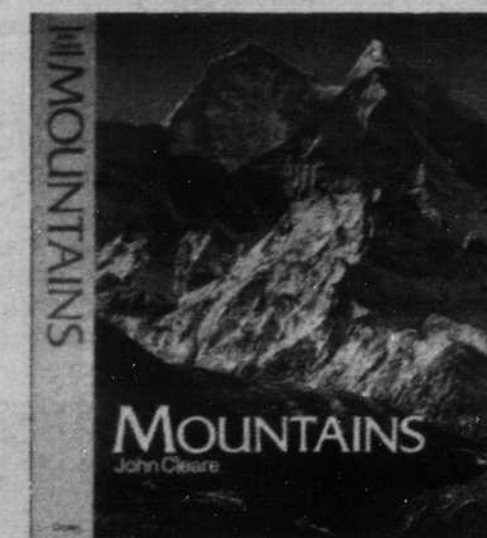


MOUNTAINS
