New tax law returns contribution

All of your money back for a \$50 political contribution?

It sounds ridiculous. But under a law revised by the 1975 Oregon Legislature, you can get one-half of your contribution back from the federal government and one-half from the state.

The revision has increased the amount of allowable tax credit from \$12.50 to \$25 for a single return and from \$25 to \$50 for a joint return.

The revision applied to returns filed on or after Jan. 1, 1976. The increase brings state law in line with federal law.

Federal law permits credits for contributions to candidates who have publicly announced their candidacy, committees supporting such candidates, political parties and committees of political parties and newsletter funds.

State law differs slightly from federal law, allowing credits for contributions to candidates who have filed a petition of nomination, filed a declaration of candidacy, or are listed on an election ballot; committees supporting such candidates; political parties and committees of political parties and organizations in support of or in opposition to ballot measures under Oregon law.

Young adults in the Eugene-Springfield area will be able to participate in a Bicentennial forensic competition with individual prizes totaling up to \$6,000.

The competition is the Bicentennial Youth Debate, underwritten by the National Endowment for the Humanities.

The University will host local and district events in the nationwide competition.

Local competition will be Oct. 29 at the EMU.

The competition is open to anyone under age 25 not currently enrolled in a high school and who has not received a baccalaureate degree. Teams and individuals are invited to enter.

Competition guides and registration materials are now available from Diane Corso, Room 211, Villard Hall, at the University. No entry fees are required. Entry deadline is Oct. 22.

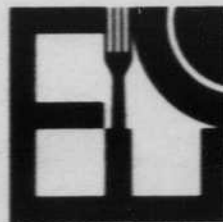
