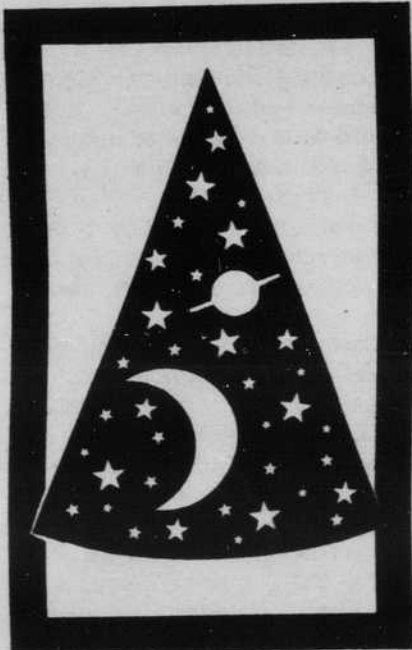

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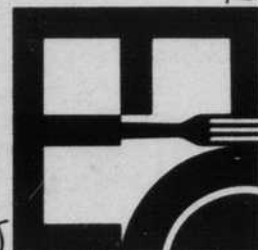

Oregon 'breathmobile' plans four-day testing

The Christmas Seal Breathmobile will return to the Eugene-Springfield area for four days of lung function testing Tuesday through Friday, according to the Oregon Lung Association.

The mobile testing unit will be located in the Willamette Plaza Shopping Center, 29th & Willamette, in Eugene, Tuesday and Wednesday. The Springfield location, on Thursday and Friday, will be the Springfield Mall, Mohawk & Columbia, in front of Payless Drug Store.

Testing hours for the Eugene location will be from 11 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. both days. Springfield hours will be Thursday, from 11 to 2 p.m. and 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. and Friday, from 11 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

All testing on the unit is free as a Christmas Seal service with persons age 18 and over eligible, however, the Lung Association urges smokers, in particular to visit the Breathmobile for testing. Test results are given at the time of the test.
