...et al Speakers, films, art diversify symposium scrutinizing Jung

A symposium on "The Archetypal Psychology of Carl G. Jung," will be held October 24 and 25 in the EMU.

Keynote speakers will be Dr. Marvin Spiegelman and Dr. Crittendon E. Brookes, both Jungian analysts. There will also be small group presentations on various aspects of Jungian psychology.

In addition to speakers, two biographical films will be shown on Saturday at 7:30 p.m. in the EMU ballroom, and the Art Museum will present an exhibit of the art of Morris Graves, regarded by Jungians as a representative of archetypal themes in the visual arts.

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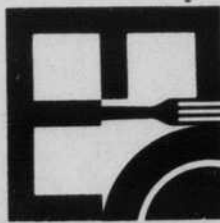
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
