The proposed policy deals with the kinds of information to be maintained by the University concerning its academic staff members; restrictions on the use and contents of, and access to, personal records of academic staff members; procedures for supplying to any academic staff member upon request the test of evaluative statements in her or his personal file; and provisions for the location, custody, retention duplication and disposal of personal records in the files of the University.

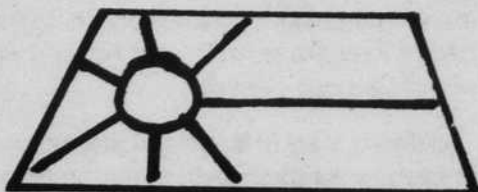
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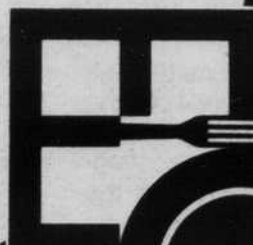
