

Slide program slated

"Willamette National Forest: Wild Lands, Resources and You" is the title of a free public slide show which will be shown on Thursday, 7:30 p.m. in the EMU.

The slide presentation will describe the U.S. Forest Service's proposed plans for the future of the Willamette National Forest. A discussion will follow the presentation. Handouts will be available on three Forest Service plans as well as a plan by conservationists called "Alternative I."

The program is sponsored by the Willamette Task Force, a consortium of conservation groups in the Eugene area.

PCC hosts vets' confab

Student veterans from throughout the Northwest will come to Portland Community College on Friday and Saturday for a conference dealing with the role of veterans on campus, the image of veterans in society and the general needs and interests of student veterans.

Dr. Amo De Bernardis, PCC president, will deliver the opening address entitled "The Impact of Veterans on College Campuses" at 1 p.m. on Friday in the Cedar Room at the Sylvania center. Later in the day there will be a showing of the Academy Award winning film about the Vietnam War "Hearts and Minds."

Dr. Gary Boyles, a counseling psychologist who teaches a class for Vietnam veterans at PCC, will lead an interpersonal workshop dealing with the

veteran's self-image and problem solving techniques. In the evening, dinner will be served at the Eagle's Club in Portland. There is no charge for any of the conference events except meals.

Saturday sessions include lobbying techniques for the benefit of all veterans, use of the media in organizing veteran's activities and a workshop on the pros and cons of VA benefits led by Grady Horton, assistant director, Veterans Administration Regional Office. Another workshop will consider "should we organize a Northwest Veterans' Association?" During the lunch break on Saturday, the film "Future Shock" will be shown. The highlight of Saturday's schedule is keynote speaker Jason Boe, president of the Oregon Senate.

The conference is being coordinated by the Veterans Club of PCC and is open to all student veterans. Anyone who is interested in attending should call the Veterans Office at Portland Community College, 244-6111. Registration will be at PCC on the morning of the conference.

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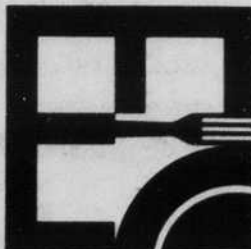
