Teacher headlines harpsichord debut

John Hamilton, harpsichordist, will present a recital Sunday at 8

p.m., in the University School of Music Beall Concert Hall.

The program, the first recital use of the music school's new Dowd harpsichord, includes "One Hundred Variations on Passacaglias" by Frescobaldi, and an "Aria with Several Variations" and the "Goldberg Variations" by J.S. Bach.

The concert is open to the public free of charge.

Hamilton has taught organ, harpsichord and music history at the University since 1959. He also has given lecture-workshops for many organizations, published

various articles and done considerable European research.

Hamilton has given numerous recitals and concerts in America and Europe, including performances at Cambridge University, the Copenhagen Cathedral, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Oberlin College and Denmark's International Organ festival at Soro. He has recorded film scores, appeared as soloist on trans-Canada radio, and made recordings on the Beall Memorial Hall organ (built in 1972 by Jurgen Ahrend).

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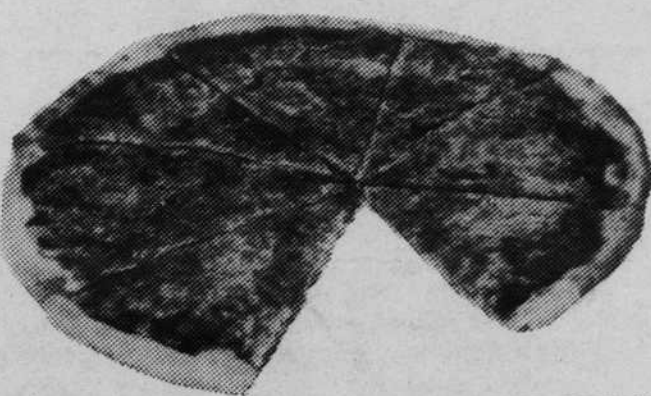

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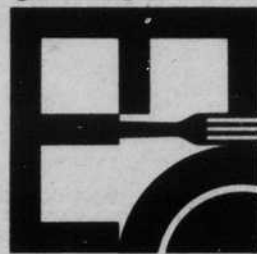

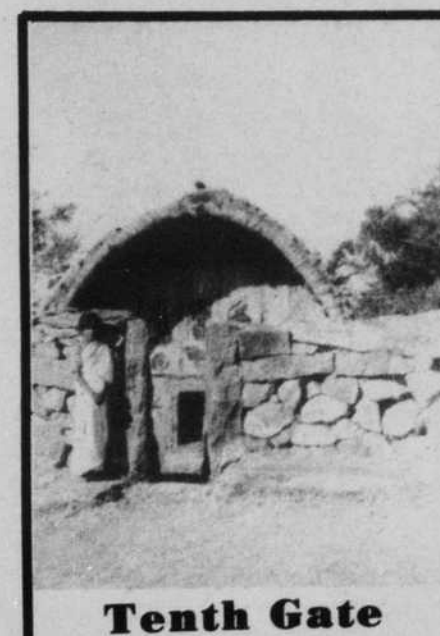
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
