Lane County's food stamp program has opened a new office on the first floor of the State Building at 165 E. 7th Avenue. The new office will serve as a certification and sales center for food stamps.

The office will operate Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. People wishing to purchase food stamps must first be certified by the state.

Two other Lane County certification and sales offices are operating in the metropolitan area. One is at 1903 W. 8th Avenue. It is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

The other is at 221 B Street in Springfield.

County increases '76 dog license fees

Dog licenses for 1976 will be on sale at the Lane County Animal Control Division in Room 20 of the County Courthouse next week.

Some 30,000 letters will be sent to dog owners in Lane County notifying them of an increase in license fees from \$5.00 to \$9.50.

However, fees for neutered dogs and those owned by senior citizens will be \$4.75.

Eugene, Springfield and Lane County recently agreed to increase the fees to improve the dog control program and secure adequate funding.

Dogs that are four months old or have a permanent set of teeth are required to have licenses. State law requires that all dogs be vaccinated against rabies, and a vaccination certificate must be presented with the license application.

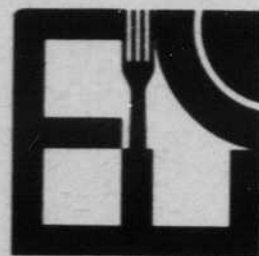
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
