

Yugoslavian post grad study leader to talk

Steven Deutsch, professor of sociology at the University has been selected to co-ordinate the University's membership in the Inter-University Center of Post-Graduate Studies in Dubrovnik, Yugoslavia.

Deutsch has scheduled a meeting today to discuss the University's past, present and future participation in the program. The meeting will be held in the Graduate Center Lounge, Chapman Hall, at 11:30 a.m.

The University has been a

member of the Inter-University Center since 1973. The Center hosts international graduate level seminars, short courses and conferences. The programs are proposed and organized by the faculty of the member institutions. The courses are taught by an international faculty and typically last one month.

Computer rate hike proposed

User reaction to a proposed rate increase for computing services is the subject of a hearing today at 2:30 p.m. in Room 205 of the Computing Center.

According to "De Bug" the

Computing Center's newsletter, the rate increase is needed to provide extra revenue for the equipment reserve fund. This money is used to replace or upgrade computing equipment. Since the current University computing systems are owned, the present rates do not take into account these costs.

The increase is also needed, said the paper, to "offset the inflated costs of salaries (12 per cent) and supplies (5-20 per cent) over the past year."

It is expected that the rate hike will reflect these increased costs and be in the 12 to 20 per cent range.

Before the new rates take effect, they have to be approved by the Computer Center advisory committees and the University administration.

Gallery exhibits photos of nudes

Educated in economics at Cambridge and Harvard, Theobald is the author or editor of twelve books and numerous magazine and journal articles, including "The Rich and the Poor" and "The Failure of Success."

His primary consulting has been with the United Nations on problems of the first and second development decades. He has appeared as a speaker before mostly university and college audiences in 46 states, but also before the top management of corporations such as Westinghouse and the Fisher Body Company.

The hearing will be held in the EMU (room to be posted) at 10 a.m.

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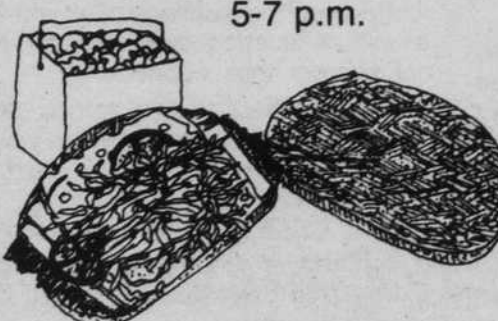

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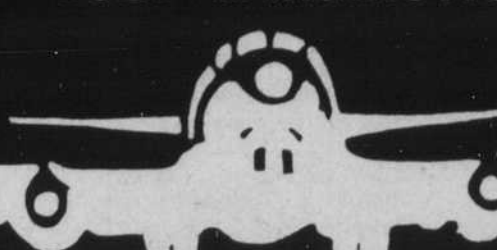
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
