

U of W professor leads forest economics caucus

Barney Dowdle, professor of economics and forestry at the University of Washington, will speak on "Economic Analysis of Public Forestry Management in the Pacific Northwest" at 3:30 p.m. Monday, in Room 189 Prince Lucien Campbell Hall. The seminar is sponsored by the Department of Economics, and is open to the public.

Professor Dowdle is noted for his articulate and vigorous exposition stating that the objectives and principles used in the management of public forest lands evolved in and were suitable for the management of forests in the feudal era. Their use in modern capitalist, socialist, or mixed economies leads to gross inefficiencies in the use of resources.
