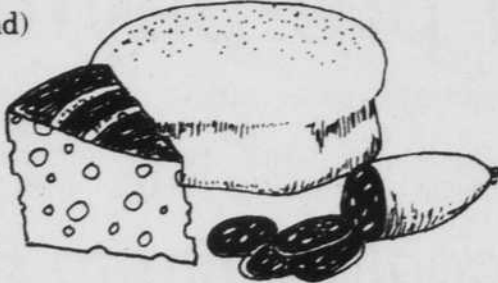

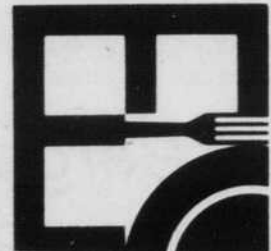

Williams takes over aid office

Emmett Williams has been appointed acting financial aids director for the remainder of the school year.

Williams, formerly associate director of financial aids, was promoted on Dec. 15 by University Vice-Pres. Gerald Bogen. He succeeds Walter Freauff, who died on Dec. 12.

According to Bogen, Freauff requested before his death that Williams be given the position of direc-

tor. Freauff was a member of the University's financial aids staff for 10 years.

The University administration has made no decision regarding any search for a permanent director. "We're trying to determine what's the most appropriate thing for us to do," said Bogen. He pointed out that Freauff's sudden death caught the administration off-guard.

Williams refused an interview with the Emerald, stating that he was too busy at this time.
