

Gymnasts stun powerful LSU

CHICAGO, Ill.—Oregon let the gymnastics world know where it stands Friday night by dumping last year's NCAA runner-up, Louisiana State, in a four-team tournament here.

It was only the second time in the last three years the Bengals have been beaten.

And they'll be in Eugene Wednesday night to see if they can reverse the situation.

Bob Ballester's Flying Ducks piled up 205.85 points to LSU's 203.30 and Ballester said Oregon's total would rank them sixth in the nation at this point in the season.

The Ducks had four competitors tie for first: Curt Rodgers, 9.30 on the pommel horse; Bob Rikli, 9.40 in vaulting; Mark Stone 9.40 on the high-bar and Scott McEldowney, 8.90 on the rings.

In the process of beating Louisiana State, Oregon easily bested Wheaton College and Illinois.

Before returning home for Wednesday's match with LSU, the Ducks will face Northern Illinois and Indiana State in Chicago tonight.

Indiana State had been the only team to beat the Bengals since 1972.

Ducks take Colorado tourney but Finley not jumping for joy

BOULDER, Colo.—Oregon went undefeated on its swing into the Rockies and pulled the coup de grace Saturday night by winning the Colorado Invitational Tournament.

But Coach Ron Finley isn't jumping for joy.

"We're still not getting a full eight minutes out of everybody," Finley said.

Finley hoped for more, but the Ducks got only two individual titles in the tournament, one from Bob Bragg at 190 and the other from heavyweight Greg Gibson.

Bragg ran his record to 12-1 with an 8-2 win over Washington's Mike Bressler while Gibson whipped New Mexico's Tom Morris, 9-1.

The Ducks piled up 77 1/4 points to beat Colorado (68), Southern Illinois (50), Washington (49 and three-fourths), Central State 43, New Mexico (18 1/2), Wyoming 13 1/4 and Colorado Mines (5).

Bragg drew the most praise from Finley. "He's been the class at 190 all year," he said.

Buck Davis, Oregon's regular at 177, suffered a hyperextended elbow in the consolation match and Finley said he would miss at least two meets.

The Ducks will host Stanford Thursday night and California Friday night, before heading up to Seattle Saturday to face Washington.

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PR's crumble as Ducks surprise Simon Fraser

The Oregon swim team pulled a major upset of sorts this weekend in defeating Simon Fraser University, defending NAIA national champions, as part of the four-way Invitational Intercollegiate Champions at Leighton Pool.
