

# Angola prospects weighed

In an effort to gain some perspective on the civil war in Angola, the *Emerald* interviewed Tshionyi Muabilai, a graduate student on campus from Zaire. Zaire lies to the northeast of Angola and shares a 2,700 kilometer border, (approximately 1,694 miles), according to Tshionyi.

"I am dismayed at the fact that the U.S. government has not been able to give as much help as it would like to," said Tshionyi, referring to the American-backed coalition of the National Front for the Liberation of Angola (FNLA) and the National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA). Tshionyi pointed out that the Soviet-backed Popular Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA) is much better equipped.

"I think the Soviet Union seems to be chicken somehow. If you

take the case of the Cuban crisis, wherever the U.S. put its foot down, the Russians retreated. They talk a lot but they retreat if someone is standing up to them," Tshionyi stated.

He is saddened to see Africans killing each other with military weapons supplied by outside powers. "If the problem was decided by the people themselves they would not have the war machinery," the African native said. He added, "How much can a tank do to a thatched hut?"

Tshionyi was asked if he had some insight into the seeming conflict between the FNLA and UNITA which are supposed to be fighting on the same side. "Disension could be caused by South African intervention. South Africa is known for its apartheid policy. People don't want to have anything to do with South Africa," Tshionyi explained.

He believes that South Africa's interest is due to guerilla attacks on South West Africa just south of Angola. Control of Angola by a government sympathetic to the guerillas would not be appealing to South Africa, Tshionyi says.

Tshionyi has his own worries about Angola possibly falling under complete control by the MPLA and having direct ties with the Soviet Union. "The Congo, to the north, has socialist leanings. There is Tanzania, socialist in nature, on the other side of Zaire. Whatever happens in Angola will have an effect on the future of Zaire," said Tshionyi. He finishes his program here soon and will return to live with his family in Zaire within the year.

"Cuban soldiers have come to Zaire and bombed two bridges there. That's a direct provocation and doesn't ease the situation," Tshionyi said.

## Judge wants court change

Change in the structure of the federal appeals court would help to alleviate its backlog of cases, according to Ted Goodwin, Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals judge and University Law School graduate.

Goodwin, speaking at the Law School Wednesday on the federal appellate process, said a bill now in the Senate Judiciary Committee would grant the Ninth Circuit Court an additional five judges to deal with their heavy case load.

The Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, which is headquartered in San Francisco and handles appeal cases for 11 Western states and provinces including Oregon, Washington and California, is presently made up of eighteen judges.



"At the rate we're now working," said Goodwin, "we could take on five new judges, and if they worked for a year, we'd be caught up (on their docket schedule)."
