Geologist gets federal grant

University geologist Alexander McBirney has received a federal grant of \$48,000 to continue his research of rocks around Skaergaard Sound, a remote part of the coast of eastern Greenland.

The National Science Foundation grant will allow McBirney to conduct his third expedition to the Greenland site this summer. The purpose of the research is to examine a large body of igneous rock, about five miles across, that rose onto the earth's crust as a liquid and crystallized slowly under very stable conditions.

Two geology graduate students, James Hoover and Richard Naslund, will aid McBirney in the summer research project.
