Lee zeroes in on more records

While Oregon's fate this season is being decided in California over the weekend, another mark is expected in the Oregon program—Ronnie Lee is only 20 points away from becoming the highest-scoring major college basketball scorer ever in the state of Oregon.

Lee presently has 1,954 points, and 20 more would move him past former Oregon State great, Mel Counts. When he gets his eighth point Friday, Lee will also become the second-highest career scorer in Pacific-8 history, topped only by former Bruin Lew Alcindor (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar). Lee has scored 949 points in conference games, while Alcindor holds the record with 1,050 points.

Meanwhile, another player has been added to the Ducks' top scoring lists. Greg Ballard became the 12th player to score 1,000 points at Oregon. Presently, with a career total of 1,018 points, Ballard needs 16 more to become one of the top ten scorers at Oregon.

Records aside, head coach Dick Harter is looking for a relatively tough time this weekend.

"There's no question we'll have to play better to win at either stop this weekend," said Harter. "California is a very explosive team that can control the tempo of the game when they have a lead. They're a team that can beat anybody on a given night."

UO, Beavs to sweep

Oregon and Oregon State should be successful in their bids to sweep both California and Stanford in the Bay Area this weekend, according to Emerald prognosticator Glen Frerichs.

The Ducks are favored by four over Cal Friday night, and should defeat Stanford by two in their Saturday night game. The Beavers hold a two-point edge over Stanford and are expected to beat the Bears by three.

Meanwhile, most Pacific-8 followers will have their eyes glued to the TV Saturday-afternoon as UCLA hosts Washington in a match-up of important conference leaders. Because the contest is being played in Pauley Pavilion, the Bruins are rated a two-point edge over the Huskies.
