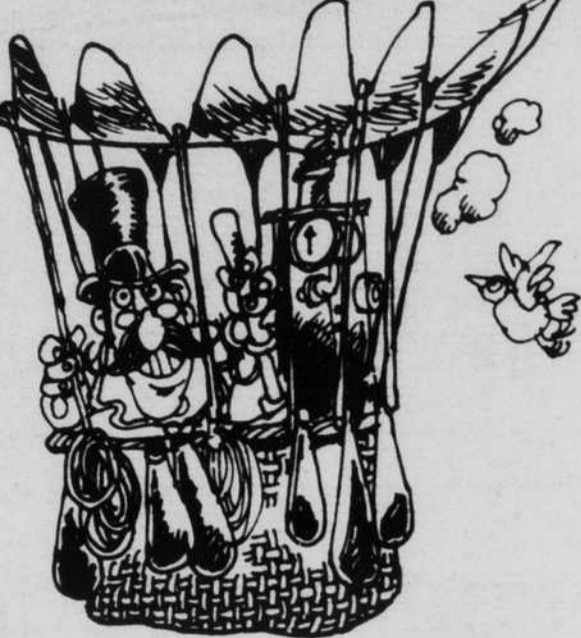

Group starts dean hunt

Harry Alpert, vice-president for academic affairs, has named a 10-member committee to begin the search for a new dean of the College of Business Administration.

The committee will begin an immediate search for a successor to Richard West, who announced his resignation last week. West has accepted the dean's position at the Amos Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H.

James Reinmuth, associate

professor of quantitative methods, will chair the committee. The committee invited ASUO Pres. Jim Bernau to nominate two students as members.

Applications and nominations for the position will be accepted through April 15. Appointment is expected July 1.

West had been dean since 1972, and is currently vice-chairer of the U.S. Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board and a board member of Bohemia, Inc.

'Feedback' to focus on fun therapy

The symposium is part of the nationwide Classical Black Heritage Project, sponsored by the Detroit Bicentennial Commission, the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and Music for Educational and Cultural Appreciation. The project's goal is to commend and document black composers' contribution to classical music.
