Oregon has most food stamp violators

WASHINGTON (AP)—Agriculture statistics indicate that Oregon had relatively more families improperly receiving food stamps than any other Northwest state.

Calculations using statistics USDA released this week show

that at least 5.21 per cent of the Oregon households certified at the local level to buy food stamps were not legally entitled to them during the first half of 1975.

As USDA released them, the statistics were limited to those

families receiving food stamps that were not totally dependent on welfare for their income.

Welfare families are automatically eligible for food stamps and USDA will not be auditing those cases until this July, officials said.

'Hoods' riot in Boston

BOSTON (AP)—About 100 youths who gathered for an antibusing demonstration threw rocks, sticks and bottles and set small fires Monday night near the Bunker Hill Monument.

The demonstration followed a weekend confrontation between antibusing advocates and police.

Police said the windshields of several police cars were smashed during the disturbance. Police were called to disperse the crowds and set up barricades on several streets to contain the violence.

Earlier in the day, both sides involved in a violent weekend confrontation between police and an-

tibusing demonstrators accused the other in separate news conferences of setting off the weekend trouble.

Police Commissioner Robert J. DiGrazia charged that the Sunday afternoon melee, during the protest march near South Boston High School, was prompted by "300 or 400 real hard-core hoods."

"We will present the type of force necessary to prevent what happened yesterday," he said.

South Boston has been the site of major disruptions since the federal court-ordered desegregation of the city schools in September 1974.
