## Organist to play Bach

Organist Lawrence Moe will perform the complete "German Organ Mass" by J.S. Bach Sunday in the University School of Music Beall Concert Hall.

The Beall Distinguished Organists' Series concert is the first performance of the entire work in the Pacific Northwest.

The recital will be heard in two parts: Part I at 4 p.m., and Part II at 8 p.m.. From 5:30 to 7 p.m., there will be an optional prime rib dinner in Gerlinger Lounge sponsored by the University Music Society.

A single ticket (\$2.50 for the general public, \$1.50 for students and senior citizens) will admit concert goers to both portions of the recital.

Admission to the concert and dinner is \$10, by reservation only. Reservations may be made by phoning the music school-community relations office, 686-3887, no later than Thursday. Tickets to the concert only may be reserved by phoning the music school, 686-3761.

In addition to the performance, Moe will give a masterclass Saturday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., in

Beall Hall. Admission is \$4.

Moe is university organist at the University of California at Berkeley. In 1952, 1953 and 1963 he received Fulbright research grants to Italy for the study of 15th and 16th century Italian dance music. In 1970 he received a Humanities Institute award from the University of California to study Rococo organs in southern Germany.

He taught at Central Washington College in Ellensburg from 1941 to 1950 and at Wellesley (Mass.) College in 1955 to 1956. He was organist and choirmaster at Trinity Church in Newton Center, Mass., from 1950 to 1952 and at St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral in Boston from 1954 to 1957. He has played numerous recitals throughout the United States and Europe.

The "German Organ Mass" comprises the entire third book of J.S. Bach's "Clavierbung." The work, a product of Bach's late years as cantor of the church of St. Thomas in Leipzig, shares with the "Art of the Fugue" and the "Goldberg Variations" qualities as his last will and testament.

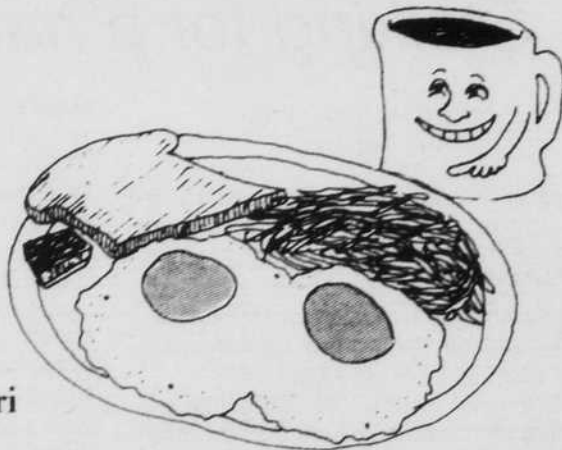

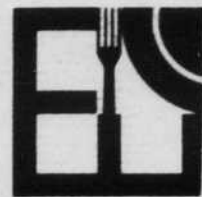

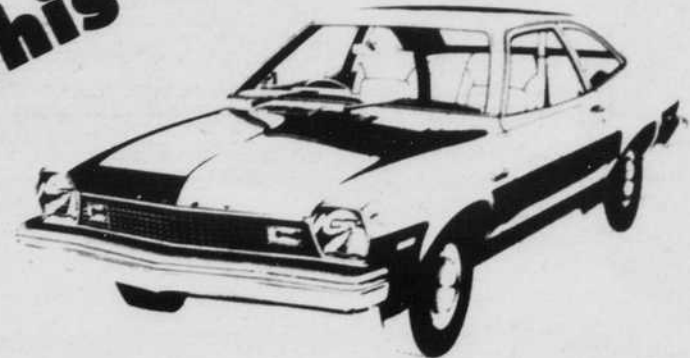
