

### VP candidate sets two talks

David Bergland, vice-

presidential candidate on the Libertarian Party ticket, will speak at 12:30 p.m. today in the EMU Forum room on "Victimless Crime Laws — Who Needs Them?" He

will also meet with faculty and graduate students at 2:30 p.m. in 823 PLC, where he will speak on "The Demise of the Two-Party System."

The Libertarians are a political party concerned mainly with the rights of individuals. They are opposed to legislation which intervenes in the private affairs of individuals. Members of the party will be on the ballot in about 35 states.

### Greeks win charity award

Sigma Alpha Epsilon has received a banner from the March of Dimes Annual Mother's March for collecting nearly \$800 for the charity.

That amount was more than any other campus living organization contributed to the drive.

Mike Hamel, coordinator of the fraternity's effort, said the banner "represents a week's work for something worthwhile." The money was collected door-to-door, and Hamel said "the work was done by everybody."

Forty per cent of the funds collected will go to Sacred Heart Hospital for machines to discover birth defects. "We're all going to be parents someday," Hamel said, "It was easy to convince people that this was important."

Although Sigma Alpha Epsilon was the only fraternity involved in the drive, Hamel said "next year we want to get everyone on campus involved."

### Caps, gowns deadline near

Students and faculty who will be participating in winter term commencement Friday, March 12, are reminded that Monday is the deadline to order caps and gowns.

It is not mandatory to wear caps and gowns during the ceremony.

Bachelor's candidates may purchase their cap and gown for \$6.75. Master's candidates may rent their cap, gown and hood for \$6.50, candidates for a doctorate are charged a \$7.50 rental fee. Faculty members may rent academic dress for the same rate as master's and doctoral candidates.

Arrangements may be made for rental or purchase at the "pen counter" at the University Bookstore at 13th and Kincaid Streets.

The ceremonies will take place at

7:30 p.m. in McArthur Court. The featured speaker will be State Sen. Edward N. Fadeley, Eugene attorney. The title of his speech will be "How the Founding Fathers Fouled Up: Civil versus Military Power."

All faculty, students and staff are encouraged to attend. Tickets for admission will not be required.
