

Council bans farm friends

The Eugene Friends of the Farmworkers (EFFW) has been banned from speaking at future meetings of the Lane County Labor Council.

Irvin Fletcher, the council's executive secretary, said the action was in response to the "disruptive tactics" employed by the EFFW. The council especially objected to the EFFW's part in the Jan. 17 demonstration at University Pres. William Boyd's inauguration which resulted in 10 arrests.

"Our membership can't identify with those kinds of things," Fletcher said. The council represents local AFL-CIO unions.

The EFFW has approached the council for funds and support for the United Farmworkers Union (UFW) several times in the past. "The UFW still has access to the Labor Council," Fletcher said. "We will continue to allow bona fide representatives to address the council."

Kurt Wilcox of the EFFW said the action was "shortsighted and it reflects a narrow view of the UFW struggle. We'll get back together with the Labor Council," he added.

Fletcher said the Labor Council has supported the farmworkers' movement for 10 years. "We have always been on record as supporting the boycott against non-union grapes and lettuce," he said.

Wilcox said, "I hope the Labor Council is sincere and will continue its support of the UFW...we've survived without substantial Labor Council support in the past and we'll probably do just as well in the future without their support."

Big screen TV rakes in foamy profits

It costs \$4,000 and it pays for itself within a year, tavern owners claim. It's videobeam—the big screen TV.

Last Saturday's UCLA basketball game played all last week on the Paddock Tavern's 70 by 52 inch screen. Their system includes a \$1,900 taping unit which allows them to record and then replay the big games.

"It's great for business," says Bob Pedersen, night manager at the Paddock. The night of the game itself, the Paddock Tavern sold a record amount of beer. Of course, the mood of the crowd helped.

"The outcome of the game means a lot," Pedersen says. "If Oregon loses, people leave right after the game. If we win, they stay and celebrate."

Duffy's manager, Adrian Clark, agrees but adds that the big screen helps food sales almost more than beer consumption. Instead of running to the refrigerator during commercials, fans barrage the bartender with orders for hot dogs and popcorn.

In the past two years six Eugene taverns have purchased giant TVs. So far, programming has been limited to sports, but some tavern owners indicate they might start showing old movies.

The Videobeam picture is projected from an upright box five feet away from the suspended screen. Tavern owners say that the major problem



is keeping the aluminum-coated screen clean. Fingerprints and smoke residue can damage the screen and recoating costs \$250.

If you have an extra \$4,000 you could buy your own Videobeam (the official name for the Advent Corp. product). But no one in Eugene has purchased one yet, says Jill Anderson, manager of Video Communications, the Advent Corp.

outlet in Eugene.

"There's only a handful of individually owned Videobeams in the entire state," she says. "But nationally, individuals account for 50 per cent of the sales."

Anderson adds that Videobeam can be leased at \$17.40 a day, but most local tavern owners have purchased them with cash.

Taping and replaying the big sporting events may present legal problems for tavern operators. A Portland tavern owner is currently being sued for not obtaining permission to replay a particular program. Most TV shows, however, can be replayed if no admission is charged and if the taping and showing are done at the same location.
