Budget story clarified

The information on the recommended budget for Intercollegiate Athletics (IA) contained in the "budget report released" article in Tuesday's *Emerald* may have been confusing to the reader.

Although the executive has recommended \$215,419.72 to allocated to IA programs for 1976-77, only \$136,010.50 of that total will go toward ticket subsidies to the Athletic Department. The additional \$79,409.22 recommended will go to fund the

Women's Intercollegiate Athletics program.
