Children of all ages are invited to enjoy a special 10-day exhibit on display at the University art museum beginning Sunday.

Entitled "Wildthings: Land, Sea, Air and No Air," the exhibit will include paintings, lithographs and sculpture depicting animals both real and imaginary.

The works are from local gal-

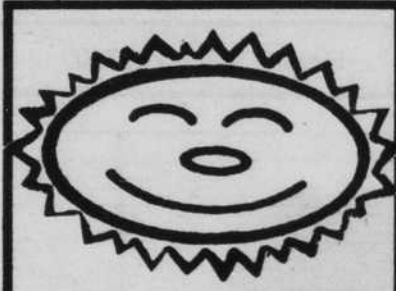
eries and private collections as well as from the museum's permanent collection. The exhibit was organized by the University's class on museology.

Free to the public, the exhibit will be held in the Focus Gallery of the museum. During regular museum hours, Tuesday through Sunday from noon to 5 p.m.

Two new shows will open in the main galleries of the museum,

also Sunday, featuring the first West Coast showing of 19th century American artist Winslow Homer's work in black and white, and ceramics by University professor George Kokis.

The exhibition will include 60 works in graphics and watercolor from the extensive permanent collection of Homer's art at Bowdoin College Museum of Art in Brunswick, Maine.

## Women's Day rally set

Sponsored by various local women's groups, a free festival and rally observing International Women's Day under the theme "A Woman's Work is Never Done" have been planned for Sunday and Monday.

Sunday festival activities, scheduled from 2 to 5 p.m. at Whittaker School, 21 N. Grand St., include skits, music, speakers and food and exhibits, plus free children's entertainment and childcare. The street theater, speakers and a media presentation of the history and goals of working women will serve as a catalyst for the Sunday mall rally scheduled from noon to 1 p.m.

International Women's Day was initiated in the early 1900s in recognition of the place of women in society. The focus of the two-day Eugene observance will be on working women, paid and unpaid, across the country and around the world. Issues emphasized for discussion during the activities include the Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW) enforced evictions of 615 Lane County families, a "herstory" of women and jobs, economic analysis, and women's struggles for equality around the world.

## Flea mart to aid museum funding

The public is invited to participate in the annual Friends of the Museum Flea Mart from 8:30 p.m. to 2 a.m. Saturday at the Fifth Street Public Market, 5th and High streets.

Tickets are \$2.50 per person and are available at the museum, from members of the Friends of the Museum, and at the door.

Bands will provide dancing music throughout the evening. Nightclub acts, games, a beer garden and bar (complete with barbershop quartet), and a fashion show of clothing by two local designers also will be featured.

Major event of the evening will be a silent auction of art works donated by artists throughout the state, plus such items as season tickets to Oregon football games, ski touring instruction, trips to the coast and mountains, and carpeting.

## Emerald corrects 'D' headline

A headline in Thursday's *Emerald* stating that reinstatement of the D grade is strongly opposed by students was in error. Students surveyed supported the return to the D grade (163 in favor, 119 opposed and 43 with no preference). The same students, however, strongly opposed reducing the number of Pass-No Pass credits (224 against the change, 65 in favor and 38 with no preference). The *Emerald* regrets the error.

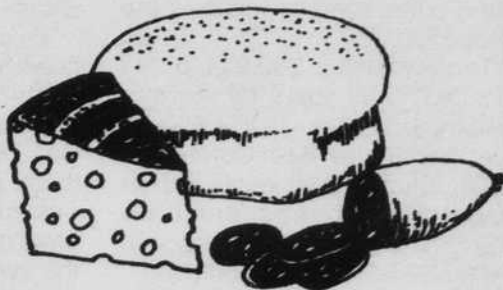
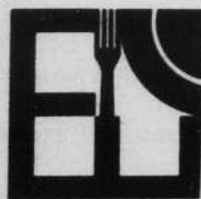
