

## Small claims School topic

This Wednesday the People's Law School will have another in its series of informational discussions on the legal system. This week's topic is small claims court—a branch of the court system established to provide speedy, inexpensive justice for lay people. It provides an informal setting for settling disputes involving \$500 or less—and attorneys are

not allowed unless they have the special permission of the judge. The People's Law School aims to demystify the law and promote a better understanding of the nature and use of the legal system. The classes are held Wednesdays at 7 p.m. at the Central Presbyterian Church at 15th Avenue and Ferry Street and are free.

The 1976 University Summer Session Bulletin is now available on campus or through the mail.

Summer session registration begins on Monday, June 21. Classes begin the following day.

It is not necessary to be admitted to the University to attend the summer session. However, a registration request card, available in the catalog, should be mailed to the summer session office by May 28 to insure that a registration packet is prepared and available on registration day.

Registration materials also can be obtained after June 21 from the Registrar's Office.

Tuition rates for full time undergraduate students will be \$216 and \$323 for full time graduate students. A \$10 refundable deposit is also required.

All students pay resident tuition and both eight and eleven week sessions are offered during the summer.

The third annual Student Film Awards sponsored by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences is being held in cooperation with the American Telephone and Telegraph Company. Cash prizes will be presented to national award winners in the following categories: animation, dramatic, documentary, experimental and special jury award.

To be eligible for the competition, a film must have been completed by a student after May 1, 1975, with production supervised by a teacher during a college or university course.

Preliminary judging for films made in the Northern California region will be conducted at the Pacific Film Archive, University Art Museum, Berkeley. Entries must be submitted to the archive by April 15. For entry blanks or more information, call regional

coordinator Linda Arlet at 642-1412. No cash awards will be presented at the regional level.

The Community Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) has decided that none of the logos submitted to the hall suit the needs of the CCPA. 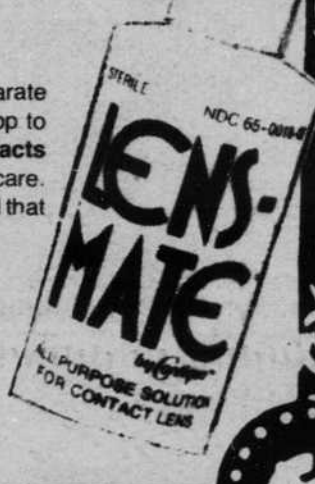

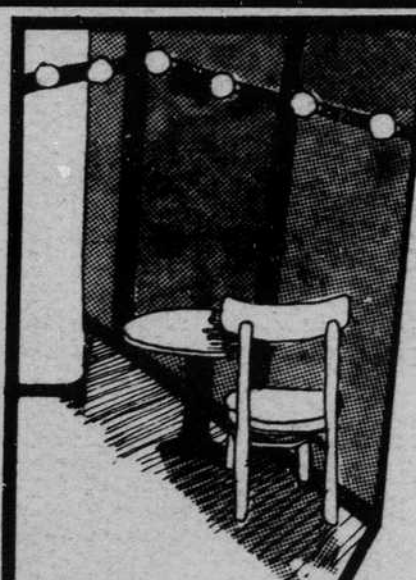

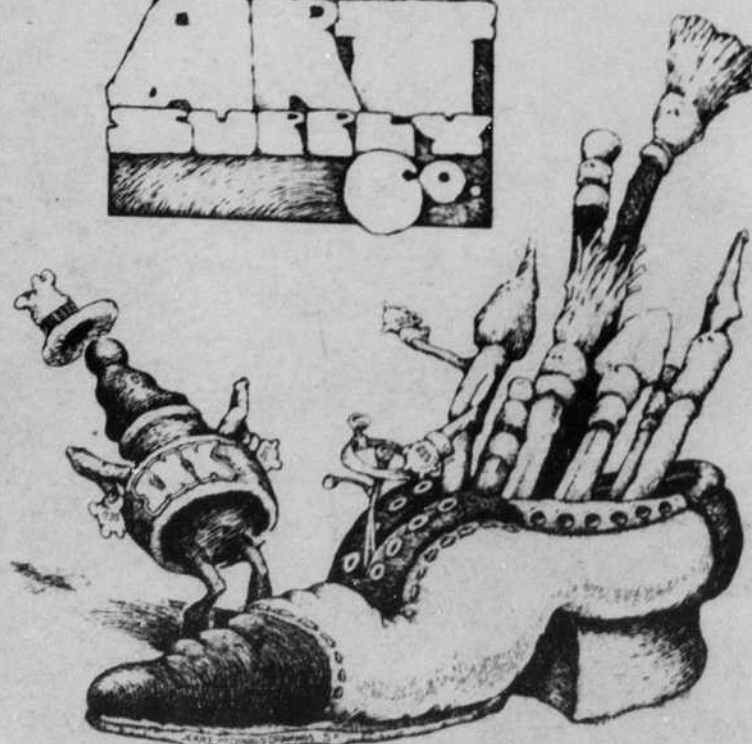
