Jan Broekhoff, professor of physical education at the University, has been elected to the American Academy of Physical Education (AAPE), a national organization limited to 125 outstanding educators of physical education and allied fields. He will officially be installed as an AAPE fellow during the organization's national convention next month in Milwaukee, Wis.

Broekhoff has been a member of the University faculty since 1973. He earned his B.S. degree from the Academy of Physical Education in Amsterdam, the Netherlands; and his M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from the University. He also has been a faculty member at the University of Toledo (Ohio).

Three other University faculty members are fellows of the academy. H. Harrison Clarke, professor emeritus, is a past president of the organization; Betty McCue, associate dean of the College of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, currently serves on the academy's Board of Directors; and Eugene Evonuk, professor of physical education, is an associate fellow.
