First win since 1971

UO netters finally bag Huskies

Oregon notched a 5-4 tennis victory over Washington Saturday, the Ducks' first win over the Huskies since 1971.

The win, which must be considered one of Oregon's biggest in recent time, was coach Buzz Summers' 100th triumph as head coach of the Ducks.

It was also the fifth straight win for Oregon, which is now 6-4 on the year.

Although No. 1 man Mike Jeung was beaten 6-0, 6-4, the Ducks took four out of six singles matches while losing two of the three doubles matches.

Ducks drafted high & low, football now after Lee

Oregon must be the only school in last week's National Football League draft that had a player go in the first round, two players go in

the last round and a basketball player go in any round.

Defensive back Mario Clark, of course, went to Buffalo in the first round Thursday. On Friday, offensive lineman Ron Hunt was taken by Cincinnati in the eighth round and defensive back Chuck Wills and placekicker Stan Woodfill went in the 17th — and last — round.

Wills, who has opted to play in the Canadian Football League for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, was taken by Washington. Woodfill, the second to last player to go in the 487-man draft, was chosen by Dallas.

The biggest surprise was Ronnie Lee, who was taken by San Diego in the 12 round as a defensive back. Lee is anxiously awaiting the June 8 NBA draft but, in the meantime, must ponder if he'll give soccer a fling, try out for the U.S. Olympic basketball team or take a shot at football.

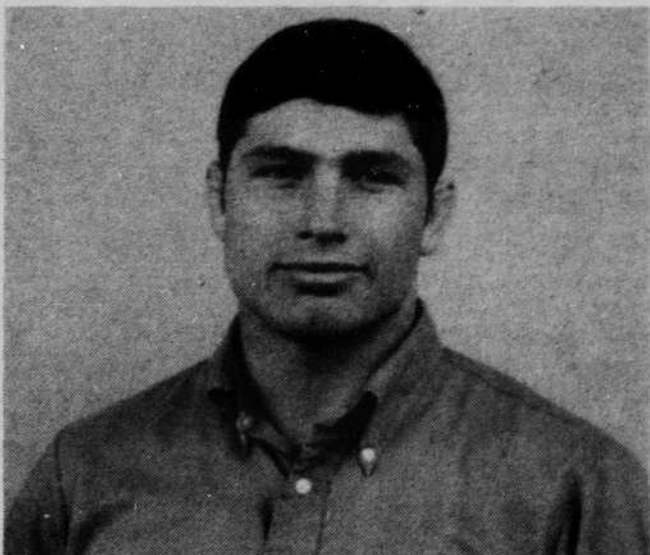
