IFC votes \$15,000 for ESCAPE funding
Nearly 50 ESCAPE program leaders flanked director Todd Mains Tuesday in a show of "unity and solidarity" as the Incidental Fee Committee (IFC) made final adjustments in the 1976-77 ESCAPE budget.
The strategy apparently paid off — the crowd cheered the committee's final allocation of \$15,731.
In other action, the committee gave the Crisis Center its full \$3,509 request. The Health Center will provide the remainder of the Crisis Center budget.
The Student Administrative Board was given \$190 for administrative expenses and 3-D, a black youth self-development program, received \$860.
The EMU Board received \$580 Monday night, well below its \$3,325 request. The board wanted salaries for all five members, but the committee agreed to pay only the director.
The Drug Information Center (DIC) received a \$6,360 allocation — \$3,300 for its drug analysis program. SEARCH received \$8,962 and the Repertory Dancers \$3,175, which includes \$1,400 for costumes and guest artists.
The Program Directors Council will meet today at 4 p.m. to discuss the IFC decision to eliminate the appeal process used in past deliberations.
