

The Beavers are comin' to town

UO should clean up in track...

Oregon and Oregon State's annual track meet is usually called the Civil War.

OSU, under first-year coach Steve Simmons, hasn't been much of a power this year. The Beavers' 84-58 victory over Cal Irvine is so far their only win in 1976, while the Ducks have lost only one dual, a 72-82 decision to UCLA in Los Angeles.

Oregon head coach Bill Dellinger points to Saturday as a tune-up for bigger meets.

"We're going to try and enter three guys in every event," said Dellinger. "We've still got minor injuries, though, that I hope are better by the time the big meets roll around."

Those injured include hurdler Stan Wigham, who's been nursing a pulled muscle several weeks now; long jumper Jon Ogard, with eight stitches in his foot after a shower accident and Denzil Davis, who recently suffered a hairline fracture in his foot.

The meet will start at 12:30 p.m. with the hammer competition. Running events will begin with the steeplechase at 2 p.m.

...but OSU favored in baseball

While Oregon's track team should pretty much have things its own way Saturday, the Duck baseball team might find a different story today when it hosts Oregon State in a single game at Howe Field beginning at 3 p.m.

The two clubs will meet Saturday in Corvallis for a double-header.

While Oregon will be trying to break into the Northern Division win column after three straight losses, the Beavers will be trying to stay in contention for the title. Now 3-2, Oregon State is just half-a-game out of the lead. Washington is third at 1-1 while the Ducks bring up the rear at 0-3.

Senior righthander Brian Peterson, the most consistent Duck pitcher this year, will likely start for Oregon today. Oregon State will probably counter with either Ken Noble (6-2) or Gale Meier (6-3).

Meier has hurled three shutouts for the Beavers and sports a 1.92 ERA. He didn't allow a run against Washington State Saturday. Noble has an ERA of 1.62 and gave up only one run in beating the Cougars last week.

Oregon State is 19-11 while Oregon is 12-8.

Oregon inked its first wrestling recruit Thursday when Dave Loftis, a senior from Beaverton's Aloha High, signed a national letter-of-intent to compete for the Ducks.

Loftis, runner-up in the 136 lb. weight class at the state AAA wrestling meet, has a 41-17-2 record in his three years at Aloha.

"Dave will provide some of the much-needed depth at 134 and 142," said Oregon Coach Ron Finley. "Losing four-year starter Suichi Shoji leaves us a little thin at these weights."

Loftis is an excellent student, carrying a 3.96 GPA.

Netters face still challenge

With number one player Debbie Borchers still ill, Oregon's tennis team may have a difficult time matching a strong Washington team Saturday at the Alder St. courts at 10 a.m.

The Huskies defeated Oregon 8-1 two weeks ago as doubles players Brenda Stroud and Julie Hutchinson scored Oregon's only point. Patti Layton, 5-2 in singles this season, will likely face Sue Goesling, Washington's top player while Linda Hartling, also 5-2 in singles, will move up to Oregon's number two spot to take on UW's Mary Schutten.

In other women's action this weekend, the softball team travels to Monmouth to compete in the OCE Invitational while the golf team heads for Gearhart for a match against Washington and Oregon State.

Ducks after regional title

Oregon hopes to unseat Oregon College of Education this weekend for the Northwest College Women's Sports Association Southern Area title in track.

Twelve to fifteen teams from Oregon and southern Washington are expected for the meet at Oregon State University.

Distance runners Cindy Rogers (5:05 mile) and Debbie Brundige (5:06 mile, 11:13 two-mile) should score for OCE, along with sprinter-hurdler Emelia Edet.

Oregon's scoring hopes in the field events lie with Karen Marshall, Leslie Winbiger and Brenda Kriger in the shot and discus and Mary Officer in the long jump.

The Ducks could have a chance to win 10 of 12 running events. Oregon favorites include: Mary Officer (220-25.5 and 100 m. hurdles-14.7), Carol Amaral (100-11.1), Dala Ramsey (880-2:17 and mile-5:03), Kim Conner (mile-4:59, 2-mile-11:10 or 3-mile-no time), and teams in the 440 relay (48.6), mile relay (3:57) and two-mile relay (9:21).

Competition begins at 10 a.m. today and 11 a.m. Saturday.

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
