The New American Movement (NAM) is organizing to demonstrate at Thursday's health care hearings in Salem.

Rep. Al Ullman, D-Oregon, chair of the House Ways and Means Committee, is sponsoring the hearings to receive testimony on national health insurance bills pending in Congress.

The NAM will demonstrate in favor of nationalization of medical-related industries and free or token payments for health care.

A White House spokesman announced Tuesday that Ford will make a luncheon tour of the University Friday, attend a Pres. Ford Committee reception at the Eugene Hotel and visit Cabax Inc., a softwood and plywood manufacturing firm.

She will go from Oregon to Sioux Falls, S.D., for a Ford Committee reception there.

Papanek's talk is part of the EMU Cultural Forum's final week of "Livability of Oregon's Future" lectures. This week's lectures deal with "Retooling Society."

Papanek is the author of "Design for the Real World," "Nomadic Furniture," and numerous other works.

Another lecture, planned for 8 p.m. Thursday, is entitled "Where to Look: Advice for Architects and Designers." The talk will be accompanied by more of Papanek's slides.
