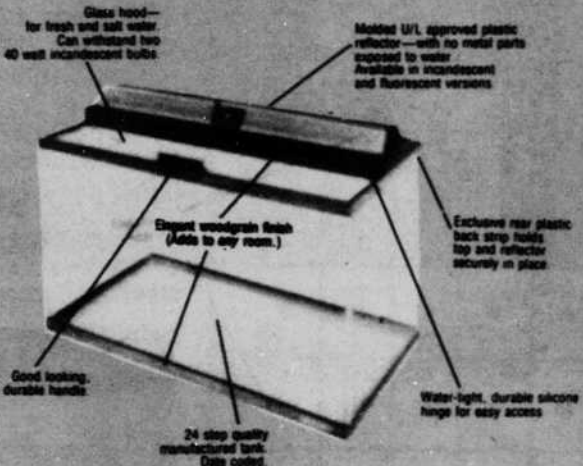

Gordon advocates big growth policies

Mel Gordon doesn't support the no-growth people or the plunderers. The candidate for state treasurer told a sparse Demo Forum audience Tuesday that he is interested in economic growth.

He's not repelled by big oil coming to Oregon, for instance, if the rigs aren't located in the Willamette River or other ecologically sensitive areas.

Gordon would like to see the state set specific environmental regulations for business. "We keep changing the goalposts. Companies know that. We're number 40 (in desirability to businesses for relocation) and we need to do something about it."

Under his Oregon Plan for Economic Development, Gordon plans to go out and recruit these businesses. "We need the jobs," he says.

Traditionally the state treasurer approves measures put forth by the Economic Development Commission and county development groups, but Gordon wants to be directly involved.

When money is to be invested he would rather place the money with Oregon banks who can then loan it to Oregon businesses.

He doesn't particularly like seeing the state in the loan business, "that's the bank's job."

Gordon, who is presently a member of the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners, will face

Women give support to youth commission

The Eugene Commission on the Rights of Women voted unanimously Tuesday night to express their strong support for the creation of a youth commission in the city to provide an advocacy role and an opportunity for young persons to make their opinions known in city government affairs.

The commission was, however, hesitant to support a proposal submitted by members of the mayor's ad hoc committee on youth to form a youth commission in equal standing with the other four commissions of the Eugene Human Rights Commission.

The Human Rights Commission was reorganized last year to form four commissions, one each for women, minorities, aged persons and handicapped persons. Due to the support for a youth commission, Mayor Les Anderson formed a committee to investigate the possibility of forming one.

Sallie Meek of the mayor's ad hoc committee, which is trying to get the proposal to the city council before the end of this school year, said "young people are considered to be ignorant everywhere." She says "young persons have an incredible amount of expertise, and they have fresh and interesting ideas." She feels the fact "that there is no law against discrimination against young persons is a discrimination."

"But," she adds, "that doesn't mean there shouldn't be one." "Young people have rights on the books they don't know about," she says, "and they need to know that."
