

Familiar sights rate 'historic' attention

The histories of Eugene and the University have been intertwined ever since Deady Hall opened its doors in 1876.

Eugene's Historic Review Board (HRB) is working to preserve two University structures which house much of that history. The HRB has recommended that both Deady Hall and Villard Hall be designated historic landmarks, and according to Judy Rees, Eugene city planner, this is very likely to occur.

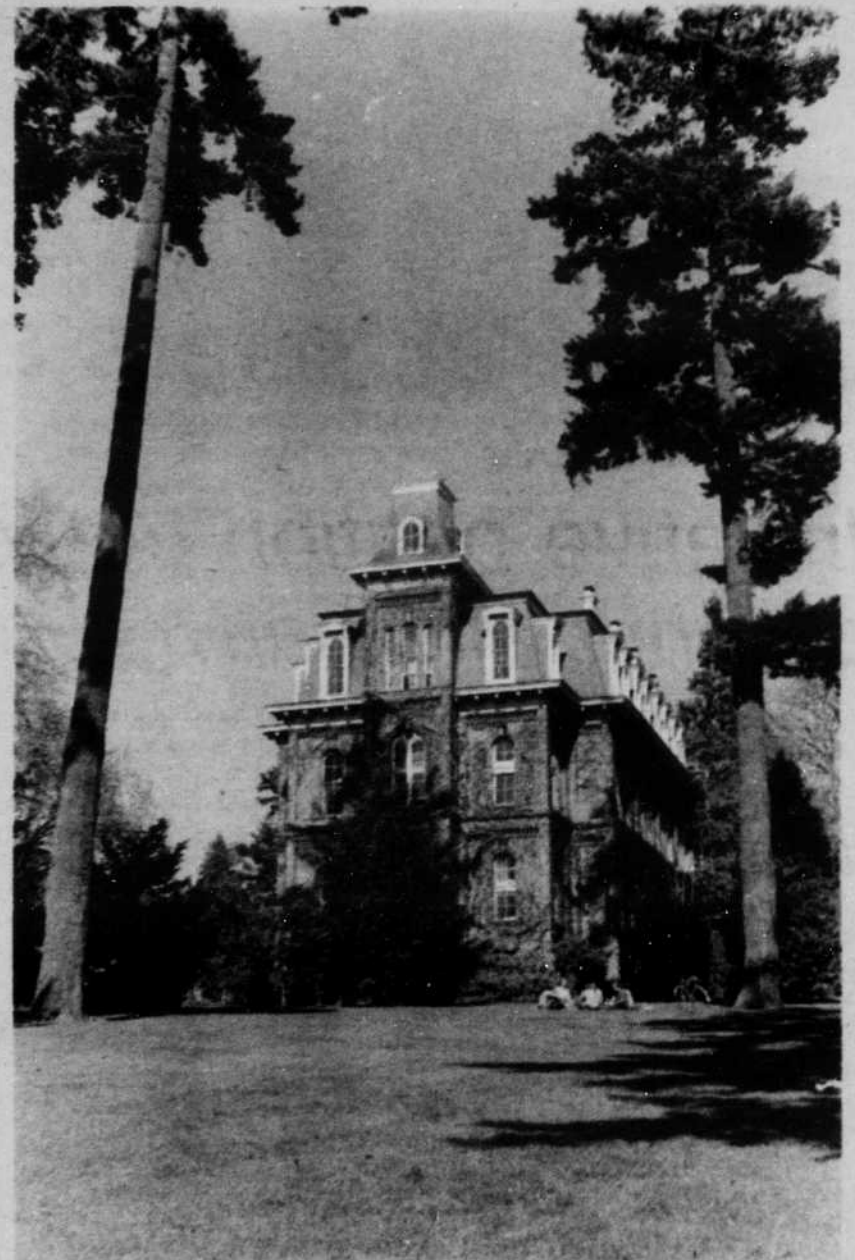
Rees says the recommendation must be approved by the planning commission and the city council, but adds that she "can't imagine there will be any problem with either."

A final decision will be delayed until the planning commission and the council hold required public hearings on the issue, says Rees.

Classification as historic landmarks would make Deady and Villard eligible for a portion of Eugene's \$30,000 historic restoration budget, Rees says. But, she adds, "In the case of Deady and Villard, being designated historic landmarks by the city is not going to make much difference." They are already listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Rees explains.

This listing has resulted in a \$25,000 federal grant for restoration of Villard, and a \$17,408 grant for Deady, Rees points out. She adds that "By 1977 or 1978, the restoration should be done."

"In the future, the HRB will be considering a number of other buildings on campus," Rees says. Among them being the main library and the faculty center.



DON'T BOYCOTT GALLO GALLO IS 100% UNION

Gallo farmworkers have been unionized since 1967. In addition to union farmworkers, Gallo employs more than 2,000 union members. Gallo's history of unionization dates back more than 30 years.

Gallo farmworkers earn up to \$12,196 annually. Seasonal workers average \$278 per week. Their union contract has a built in escalation clause increasing pay scales for both permanent and seasonal workers annually. PLUS fringe benefits:

Paid pension plan, paid vacation, paid holidays, premium paid overtime, paid major medical insurance for the entire family and paid life insurance.

A secret ballot election for Gallo farmworkers was conducted by the State of California Agricultural Labor Relations Board to resolve the jurisdictional dispute between the Teamsters Union and the United Farmworkers Union at the Gallo Ranch.

Gallo farmworkers voted: 223 for Teamsters Union — 131 for United Farm Workers Union. An additional 195 ballots were challenged by the election supervisors, by the unions and by Gallo.

The A.L.R.B. is in the process of determining which union won the election.

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
