### 3-day Angolan program set

Ole Gjerstad and Chantal Sarrazin, who have recently returned from the former Portuguese colonies of Angola, Mozambique and Guinea-Bissau in Southern Africa, will present slides and commentary of the on-going liberation

struggle Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Gjerstad will present a slide commentary on "People's Power in Angola" in the EMU Tuesday at 8 p.m.

Wednesday at 8 p.m. in the EMU, Sarrazin and Gjerstad will present "Revolution in Southern Africa and Guinea-Bissau," a discussion of Socialist development in the newly independent nations

of Mozambique and Guinea-Bissau, Apartheid, and the current struggle for the liberation of Namibia or South West Africa. A filmstrip entitled "Liberation Struggle in Namibia" will accompany this program.

The final presentation will be a slide commentary by Sarrazin on "Women in Guinea-Bissau" at 3 p.m. Thursday in the EMU. All room numbers will be posted in the EMU lobby the day of presentation.

Gjerstad and Sarrazin have just returned from a successful first-hand documentation of their recent work with liberation movements in Africa sponsored by the Canadian based Liberation Support Movement. Their stay in Eugene is being sponsored by the Black Student Union, the Center for the Sociological Study of Women, EMU Cultural Forum, political science department and

the Foreign Student Organization. There is no charge for any of the presentations and the public is invited.

The *Oregana*, the official University yearbook, is open to publication bids on its 1977 edition. Samples of the publisher's work will be considered as a factor in determining the final bid.

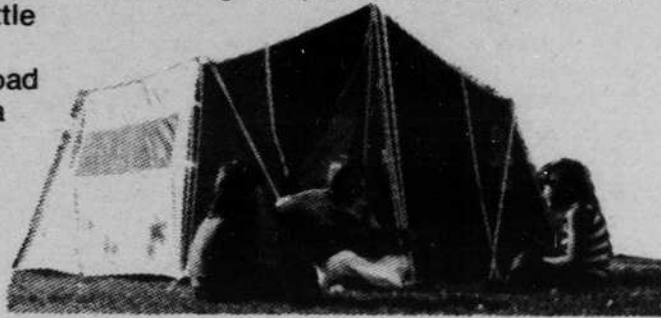
All bids should be sent to Robert Melton, *Oregana* editor, M-111, EMU, Eugene, Oregon, 97403. Bids should be received no later than May 27.

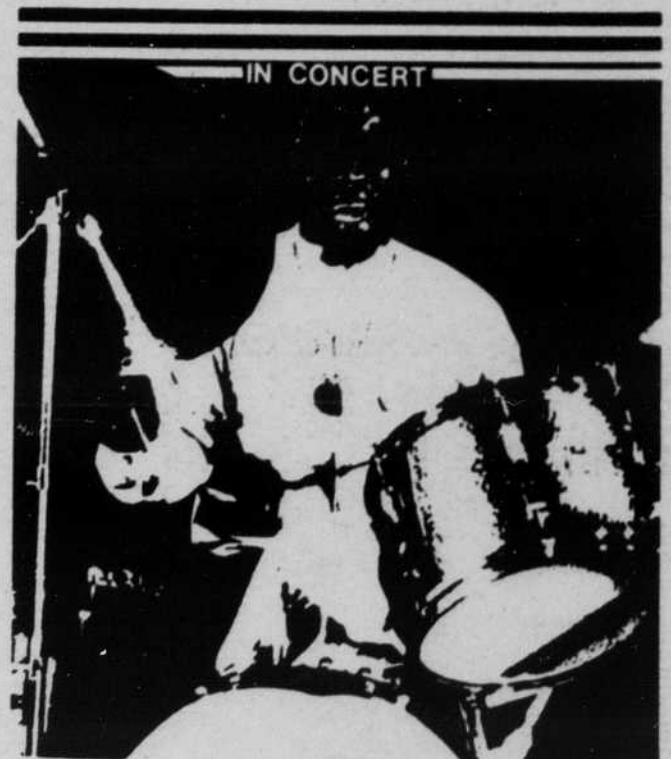
