A three-month trek in Nepal by members of the University Outdoor Program is the subject of a three-screen, slide-tape show tonight at 8 in 177 Lawrence.

The show includes slides of Katmandu, Eugene's new sister city, as well as trekking in the Mt. Everest and Annapurna regions. The five-member Outdoor Program group trekked nearly 500 miles through Nepal's rugged Himalayas, climbing to elevations about 18,000 feet several times.


