Norman Cherniss, executive editor of the *Riverside Press-Enterprise*, Riverside, Calif., will be at the journalism school Thursday and Friday as an editor-in-residence.

Cherniss will appear at several classes and seminars and will meet informally with students and faculty members. His visit is sponsored by the American Society of Newspaper Editors and the *Press-Enterprise*.

Cherniss is a former editorial writer for the *Des Moines, Iowa Register-Tribune* and also has been a staff member on other newspapers in Indiana, Iowa and California. He was a Nieman Fellow of Harvard University in 1958-59.

The California editor has been a visiting lecturer at the University of California at Los Angeles and the University of Southern California. He also spent a year at the Graduate School of Journalism of Columbia University as a visiting professor and editor-in-residence. He is a member of the National Conference of Editorial Writers and the American Society of Newspaper Editors.

ing, non-discrimination and the "Consumer's Guide to Classes." All students are urged to attend.

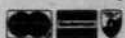

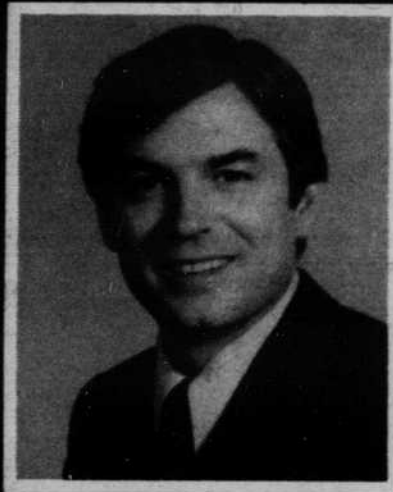
